FAQs

When will the tree be planted?

The Park District plants tree donations twice a year. We select one day in the spring and one day in the fall based on when we have enough trees to fill a day of planting.

How big will the tree be when planted?

Deciduous, single-trunk trees are measured by caliper, the diameter of the trunk 6" above the root ball. The height of the tree varies by species and supplier (approx: 12"-16" high).

Multi-stem and evergreen trees are measured by height.

Why aren't ash trees available to donate?

Due to the infestation of the Emerald Ash Borer in Northern Illinois, the Park District put a moratorium on planting all ash tree species in our district. Once the borer is eradicated, we hope to resume planting these trees again.

- The Park District reserves the right to approve in the selection of tree species best suited for the soil type and location of the tree planting.
